2022-23 Ann's Place Capital Campaign to Renovate After a Flood




About Ann's Place

Ann's Place provides help and hope to those living with cancer and to their loved ones. Our clinical social workers, facilitators and wellness experts provide a host of services aimed at improving quality of life during and after cancer. Services include counseling, fifteen different support groups, horticulture therapy, movement programs (such as yoga, dance and Tai Chi), creative programs (such as art and writing) and mediative programs.

Ann's Place relies on the generosity of donors to be able to continue providing these services *free of charge*.

Our mission is to provide comfort, support and resources to people living with cancer and to their loved ones. We assist each person to create a unique pathway through cancer to improve the quality of their life.



Project Description

Over the long Easter/Passover weekend in 2022 a burst pipe in the first floor kitchen dislodged and sent thousands of gallons of water throughout the building. The flood destroyed floors, walls and furniture in over eleven rooms. After staff and leadership got over the initial shock of the situation, we got to work looking at what needed to be fixed and what improvements could be made in the process.

With over ten years of clinical work in the building and the changes in programs over the last several years due to the pandemic, we have learned a lot about what kind of space we will need to enhance our counseling, support groups and wellness programs.


While insurance will cover the basic repairs, there are many things that require additional funding. The following projects will need community financial support to move forward.

First Floor Accessibility, Counseling, Support Groups and Wig Salon Improvements not covered by insurance: \$76,500



The Betsy McAuliffe "Salon" and Counseling Room

The point in treatment when a woman's hair begins to fall out or thin is an extremely emotional time. Our counselors are seeking a safe place to hold wig fitting sessions that also can be used for counseling.

- Living room style storage for wigs of every color and length, wig supplies, scarves and other beauty needs
- Area that allows for counseling during these emotional appointments
- Tuck-away vanity to remove triggering emotions in other counseling sessions.
- Replace broken heat pump serving this room, kitchen and other counseling room.



Accessible Front Doors

Our clients who have had surgeries or use a walker or wheelchair have great difficulty getting through our front doors.

 Fully automate the front doors with sensor





Mitchell Dining Nook and Event Preparation Area

- Provide much needed counter space for event preparation for events such as live nutrition classes and healthy eating potluck events.
- Allow staff to take a needed break after emotional work
- Better storage for healthy snacks for programs










Family Activity Center – Lower Level Improvements Not Covered by Insurance \$150,500

 Floor outside elevator industrial carpet for high traffic area. Carpet tiles.




Movement and Yoga Room

Yoga, Tai Chi, Healthy Steps dance and exercise programs are a vital part of health for those facing cancer. Not only do these programs reduce stress, they increase circulation which alleviates pain, helps sleep and enhances healing. We have no place to store supplies for these programs and need a better way to integrate online class participants into a live class when they are too sick to drive to Ann's Place or live far away. The new room would have:

- A design to meet the needs of variety of movement programs
- Integrated Technology for online and in-person wellness classes
- Better storage for yoga matts, exercise bands and chairs for chair yoga
- Client sign-in area
- Upgraded flooring








Nancy's Clubhouse - Children's Play-Therapy Room

The children served most by Ann's Place have a parent or sibling with cancer. Often, the biggest concern our clients with cancer have is how their children and family will react to their diagnosis. Our counselors help young children, tweens and teens process instead of bury their feelings in age-appropriate therapy sessions. We also hold family nights and have a Kid's Club so children can play together and know they are not alone. We hope to open the new children's room in 2023 and it will include:

- Outdoor themed Playhouse and Storytime tree for younger kids
- Foosball, Lego wall and yogibos for older kids
- Age-appropriate "nooks" designed to hold therapy sessions
- Activity tables for Kids Club nights




Idea Board for Nature Themed Therapy Room



Air Filtration to reduce spread of viruses and allergens for immune compromised clients

The pandemic has taught us all the importance of good air flow. We discovered in 2020 that Ann's Place was built for maximum air conservation, which was great for energy efficiency, but it lacks the ability to handle higher filtration that is desired for our client population. We would like to add:

- Dehumidifier and air purifying system that flows air to all three Family Activity Rooms
- Depressurize foundation to reduce ground gasses
- Balance negative air pressure caused by exhaust fans




